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

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ATHENS AT A GLANCE



ATHENS IS A SPECIAL PLACE: a small town with welcoming people, a big university and many of the amenities of a big city, like vibrant music, arts and food scenes. It hasn't always been that way, though. Recent elections have brought a renewed interest in issues of equity of social justice. With that in mind, here's some background through that lens on Athens' history and the current political landscape. To keep up with all things Athens, pick up a copy of the free weekly *Flagpole* magazine, and visit flagpole.com for daily news updates.

HOW WE GOT HERE

Athens and the University of Georgia have been intertwined from the beginning. The state legislature chartered the University of Georgia in 1785, making UGA the oldest public university in the country, no matter what anyone in North Carolina says. Future governor John Milledge, who bought the university's initial 633 acres from early settler Daniel Easley in 1801, named the village-to-be for the Greek cradle of philosophy. Ironically, considering Athens now has over 100 bars, it was chosen because it was far from any taverns that might distract students.

Athens was incorporated in 1806. In the decades that followed, the town became known as the "Manchester of the South," because of its cotton mills. James Camak led the building of the city's first railroad, connecting Athens to Augusta in 1841.

Other than a minor skirmish, Athens saw no action during the Civil War, but participated nonetheless. The Cook and Bros. armory across the river from downtown—now the Chicopee-Dudley building, housing UGA offices—manufactured rifles for the Confederacy. On a lighter note, local dentist John Gilleland devised a double-barreled cannon that failed spectacularly when tested. The chain connecting the ball snapped, knocking over a chimney and killing a cow. The cannon is now displayed outside City Hall, facing north.

Many prominent rebels—including Confederate Vice President Alexander Stephens, former U.S. House Speaker Howell Cobb and his brother, T.R.R. Cobb, whose writings defended slavery—had ties to Athens. Plantation slave labor funded the construction of many grand antebellum homes, such as T.R.R. Cobb's, which is now a museum in the Cobbham neighborhood.

Slave labor also helped build UGA. The remains of 105 individuals, mostly slaves or former slaves of African descent, were unearthed during a recent construction project at Baldwin Hall. Subsequent research revealed that the university rented slaves from nearby slave owners, and that much of North Campus had been built on top of a cemetery used by African Americans through the 1880s. A memorial was erected at Baldwin Hall in 2018 honoring those who were buried there.

In 1872, Howell Cobb's sister, Laura Cobb Rutherford, spearheaded the construction of an obelisk honoring the Confederate dead, now located in the median on Broad Street downtown. Her daughter, Mildred Rutherford, was a prominent educator and advocate of the discredited "Lost Cause." In addition, Howell Cobb's speeches attacking black citizens' newly won right to vote helped inspire the formation of the Ku Klux Klan in Georgia. While many locals now want to remove the monument, state law prevents the city from doing so.

By the turn of the century, Athens had public schools, a police force and its first streetcar suburbs, Boulevard and Five Points. In 1891, the State Normal School, a teacher's college, opened in what's now called Normaltown. The Navy took over the college in the 1950s, training its Supply Corps there. When the

Navy school moved to Rhode Island in 2011, UGA acquired the property and turned it into a health sciences campus.

In the early 20th Century, black-owned businesses were flourishing on the Hot Corner at Hull and Washington streets, centered around the Morton Theatre, built by wealthy developer Monroe "Pink" Morton, the son of a former slave. But race relations remained tense. Hamilton Holmes and Charlayne Hunter integrated UGA in 1961, sparking near-riots. In 1964, Athens Klansmen murdered Lemuel Penn, a black soldier who was passing through town. Marches and sit-ins were held at the popular fast-food restaurant The Varsity. Local public schools didn't fully integrate until 1970, 16 years after *Brown v. Board of Education*. This was also the time of "urban renewal," which brought a health clinic, better housing and more improvements to black neighborhoods but caused the destruction of other "slums."

Downtown largely emptied out when Georgia Square Mall opened on Atlanta Highway in 1981, which paved the way for Athens to become the music mecca it is today. R.E.M. was about to hit it big, and entrepreneurs took advantage of the vacancies to open venues like the 40 Watt Club.

Clarke County and the City of Athens, after two previous failed attempts, merged in 1990, and the newly unified Athens-Clarke County elected Gwen O'Looney as its first female and first progressive mayor.

Today, the mall is struggling, while downtown has become in some ways a victim of its own success. The proliferation of luxury apartment complexes has brought rising rents and more chains, increasingly catering to (mostly white) students and pushing locally owned businesses out into the Five Points, Normaltown and Chase Park areas. Historically black neighborhoods like East Athens and the Hancock Corridor that have suffered for decades from lack of investment are now ripe for gentrification.

These issues and more galvanized voters in 2018. They swept five new, more liberal commissioners into office and chose another progressive, Kelly Girtz, as mayor in a landslide. The new group is now tackling issues like affordable housing and criminal justice reform.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

Flagpole's City Dope column is a great resource for keeping up with local politics.

The ACC Commission includes 10 members, each representing a district, and the mayor, who is elected countywide and presides over meetings but only votes in case of a tie. It meets at least three times a month: Work sessions, where staff give presentations on upcoming decisions, are at 5:30 p.m. on the second Tuesday. Agenda-setting meetings, which include further discussion as well as public input, are at 6 p.m. on the third Tuesday. Voting meetings are at 6 p.m. on the first Tuesday of the following month. All three are at City Hall (301 College Ave.) and televised on Channel 180 on Charter cable and streamed at youtube. com/accgov. Agendas, background information and contact information for county officials are available at accgov.com.

The Clarke County Board of Education, composed of nine members who elect a president from among themselves, meets in the H.T. Edwards Building (440 Dearing Extension) on the first and second Thursdays of the month at 6 p.m. The district is led by Superintendent Demond Means, hired in 2017 to address the gap between white and minority students, who make up three-quarters of its 14,000 students. CCSD's website is clarke.k12.ga.us. Agendas are posted at boarddocs.com/ga/clarke/Board.nsf/Public 24 hours before the meeting.

Although Athens is roughly 70 percent Democratic, due to gerrymandering, it's represented by four Republicans and just one Democrat in the state legislature. Republicans still dominate both the House and the Senate, despite losing seats in 2018, when Gov. Brian Kemp only narrowly defeated Democrat Stacey Abrams (without much help from his hometown of Athens). The General Assembly meets for 40 working days a year, starting on the second Monday in January and ending sometime in late March (before the Masters golf tournament). Check legis.ga.gov to contact legislators, read the text of bills and watch the action on live-stream.

Athens has numerous activist groups working on labor, discrimination, LGBTQ, immigration, transportation and other issues. 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
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UGA also hosts nearly daily lectures, exhibitions, readings and discussion groups that are open to the public; check Flagpole's Calendar or calendar.uga.edu for the latest.

HOW TO GET AROUND

WALK/BIKE: Downtown, North Campus and most intown neighborhoods are compact and easy to get around on foot or bike. (Drivers, remember to stop for pedestrians!) The North Oconee River Greenway runs from Sandy Creek Nature Center through downtown, with another leg to College Station Road on the Eastside under construction. Only a short stretch of the Firefly Trail, between downtown and Dudley Park, is open, but it will eventually run all the way to Winterville. BikeAthens has a map of streets with bike lanes.

SCOOT: The ACC Commission temporarily banned electric scooter rentals last year, but they're expected to return in late 2019, once regulations are in place.

DRIVE: On-street parking downtown is \$1.50 per hour between 8 a.m.-10 p.m. Monday–Saturday, with a two-hour time limit from 8 a.m.–6 p.m. Meters accept cards and coins. Tickets will run you \$20-\$25. Avoid the risk by parking in a deck—they're free for the first half-hour (and all day Sunday) and \$1 per hour after that. Most surface lots are operated at night and on weekends by National Parking, which usually charges \$5 and can tow or boot you if you don't pay. On campus, surface lots are permit-only, so visitors should park in a deck. See downtownathensga.org and parking.uga.edu for more.

TAKE A CAB: Athens taxis are mostly large vans shared with other passengers. Fares aren't metered; they're based on zones and should be posted inside the cab. Vans gather by the Arch late at night. Expect to be asked whether you're going to the Eastside or Westside. With multiple stops to make, the ride might take a while. Uber and Lyft also operate in Athens.

TAKE A BUS: Athens Transit (athenstransit.com) buses leave in all directions from the Multimodal Center on East Broad Street, down the hill from downtown. Fares are \$1.75 for adults; UGA students, faculty and staff, seniors over 65 and kids under 18 ride free. Everybody rides free on Campus Transit (transit. uga.edu). Buses mostly run through campus, but routes along Milledge Avenue and Prince Avenue stop at a handful of off-campus locations. Both agencies have apps that allow you to track buses.

SKIP TOWN: Southeastern Stages (southeasternstages.com) intercity buses leave from 4020 Atlanta Hwy. Megabus (us.megabus.com) also runs intercity buses out of the Multimodal Center at 775 E. Broad St. Groome Transportation (groometransportation.com) will take you from one of several pick-up locations to Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport in Atlanta. Amtrak's Crescent (amtrak.com) stops in Gainesville on its run between New Orleans and New York City.



FIVE DOWNTOWN PUBLIC ART PROJECTS TO CHECK OUT

FIRE UP THE HYDRANTS

A project of the Athens-Clarke County Public Utilities Department, Fire Up the Hydrants transformed 20 ordinary hydrants into functional, lifesaving works of art. Spread across downtown, the hydrants were cleverly hand-painted by local artists, including Sarah Cook, Lilli Sams, Dan Smith and Jennifer Zwirn.

ART DECKO

Organized by the Athens Area Arts Council, Art Decko is a series of nine large-scale paintings installed on each floor of the Vertical Gallery, an unconventional stairwell-turned-art space in the College Avenue Parking Deck. Artists include Ashley Anderson, Jared Brown, Jeremy Kiran Fernandes, Ruth Allen, Jacob Wenzka, Hannah Betzel, Will Eskridge, Jeanne Whatley and Dorian Edwards.

BIRDSONG

Commissioned by AthFest Educates to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the AthFest Music and Arts Festival, David Hale's "BirdSong" mural is comprised of 20 species of native songbirds flying across an exterior wall of Epiphany, on the corner of Washington and Pulaski streets.

HOT CORNER: AN ATHENS LEGACY

Downtown's newest mural, at the corner of Lumpkin and Washington streets, is dedicated to the rich history of Hot Corner, a hub of African-American entrepreneurship. Organized by the Athens Cultural Affairs Commission with support from a National Endowment for the Arts grant, the mural was created by Miami-based muralist Elio Mercado and local artist Broderick Flanigan.

PROJECT GINKGO

Beautifying the concrete bases of light poles with intricate mosaics, Krysia Ara's Project Ginkgo adds glittering charm and color into the downtown landscape. Funded by the Athens Downtown Development Authority, each design is unique and can be found outside of Flicker Theatre and Bar, The World Famous, Epiphany, Creature Comforts and Ciné.

There's so much to see and do in Athens, and not all of it falls into a neat, easily labeled category. Here are a few of the Classic City's extra-special offerings that we truly love, with plenty to enjoy for visitors and residents alike.

BIKE TRAILS: Athens boasts a thriving, tightknit cycling community that takes full advantage of the area's riding options. In addition to the North Oconee River Greenway, several local parks feature bike-friendly trails, including Trail Creek and Oconee Forest parks. (See Parks and Recreation on p. 18.) There are lots of trails within easy driving (or cycling) distance, like the ones at Fort Yargo State Park in Winder. The most comprehensive resource for local cyclists is **BikeAthens** (1075 W. Broad St., 706-249-9550, bikeathens.org).

RIVER FUN: There are a few intown and nearto-town purveyors of Broad and Oconee river trips for kayakers, canoers and those who wish to simply float lazily in a tube. These are at-your-own-pace trips that can be good for a special occasion—or just a warm day. The closest one to town is **Big Dogs on the River** (2525 Atlanta Hwy., 706-353-6002), but there's also **Broad River Outpost** (7911 Wildcat Bridge Road, 706-795-3242, see ad on p.59) in Danielsville, and **The Sandbar** (3435 King Hall Mill Road, 706-245-4163) in Bowman.

BEHIND THE MUSIC: There's nothing else here or, perhaps, anywhere quite like **Nuçi's Space** (396 Oconee St., 706-227-1515, nuci.org), a resource center for Athens' legion of music creators. Founded nearly two decades ago by former Athenian Linda Phillips in memory of her son Nuçi, a suicide victim, the organization offers rehearsal spaces for hourly rental, as well as medical and mental health resources for under-insured musicians. It also operates Camp Amped for budding local superstars. (See Specially for Kids on p. 20.)

HIGH TIMES: For those who want to soar, **Canopy Studio** (160-6 Tracy St., 706-549-8501, canopystudio.org, see ad on p. 20) offers instruction in trapeze and other movement arts, with the mission of providing a safe and inclusive space for residents of all ages and backgrounds. In addition to its classes, the nonprofit stages performances that are open to the public. **Active Climbing** (665 Barber St., 706-354-0038, activeclimbing.com, see ad on p. 29), Athens' only indoor climbing gym, offers airconditioned adventures for all skill levels.

LIFE SKILLS: Founded by poet and activist Lemuel "Life" LaRoche, **Chess and Community** (chessandcommunity.org) teaches the game to local youth "to develop critical thinkers and engage the next generation of leaders." With a focus on underserved populations, the nonprofit also administers the Think Before You Move college scholarship and hosts an annual conference at the Classic Center featuring a chess tournament, essay contest, art show and more.

COLLEGE SPORTS: The **University of Georgia** is known for its football program—the 2019 season brings high hopes for coach Kirby Smart and his Dawgs—but the school has seen Division I success in lots of other sports, including baseball, women's basketball, gymnastics, swimming, equestrian and more. And the men's basketball team is set to improve under second-year coach Tom Crean, making this an ideal year to catch any number of UGA sporting events. See georgiadogs.com for schedules and tickets.

ROLLER DERBY: A member of the Women's Flat Track Derby Association, the tough-as-nails Classic City Rollergirls (classiccityrollergirls.com) battle roller derby squads from around the region at Athens Arena (280 Commerce Blvd.). The bout season runs from spring through summer, and the group hosts free boot camp sessions several times each year for anyone interested in donning the green and black.

CREATIVE COMEDY: While stand-up showcases can be found around town, the newly opened **Moonlight Theater Company** (675 Pulaski St., Ste. 1400, moonlighttheatercompany.com), operated by École Philippe Gaulier alumnus Chase Brantley, specializes in "fresh, innovative and original comedy from around the world." In addition to performances ranging from improv to theater, stand-up and beyond, Moonlight also offers classes in clowning and comedy for kids and adults.

LISTEN AND LEARN: Dedicated to the art of storytelling, **Rabbit Box** (rabbitbox.org)—named for a tune by the late, great Athens songwriter Vic Chesnutt—hosts a monthly series at The Foundry that features local folks sharing true tales from their lives. By turns funny, poignant, challenging and inspirational, the event provides a heartwarming look at the rich tapestry that is Athens. Interested storytellers can sign up in advance, and the shows are open to the public.

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SPECIALLY FOR KIDS



S ure, Athens has its share of typical kid haunts—roller skating, bowling, wandering the mall—but whether you're raising a townie or just trying to entertain some visiting family, there are lots of Athens-specific destinations to consider. Since kids are already a strain on the budget, this list focuses mainly on things that can be experienced for free or nearly free. If you can make any of these items regular stops on your schedule, you can rest easy knowing they're being raised right.

PLACES TO PLAY


Athens has some great parks, but what makes them interesting is their diversity. Here are the highlights of select parks that offer the best options for kids of any age.


Ben Burton Park (615 Mitchell Bridge Road): Best for hiking along the river and

taking a dip in the stream that feeds into it. Check out the old power station ruins along the trail.

Southeast Clarke Park (4400 Lexington Road): The primary draw for this park is the recently revamped World of Wonder playground, but it's also a good place for bike riding, walking and skateboarding. (It even has a Tony Hawk-designed bowl!)

SPLASH PADS: In the summer, cool off for cheap (\$1 admission) at Rocksprings Park (291 Henderson Ext.) and Trail Creek Park (200 Trail Creek St.). These low-key water parks are great options for little ones just learning to play in the water—or bigger ones who want to get sprayed. You can also find pools (\$1 admission) at Rocksprings, Bishop (705 Sunset Dr.), Memorial (293 Gran Ellen Dr.) and Lay (297 Hoyt St.) parks. If you're a Clarke County resident and your child got all As and Bs this year, bring their report card to the Bishop Park aquatics office for free admission perks!





State Botanical Garden of Georgia (2450 S. Milledge Ave.): This was always a good place to bring kids, but the addition of the new Alice H. Richards Children's Garden makes it a can't-miss spot. This combination garden and playground has options for all ages, and offers both typical playground features as well as an "in the woods" treehouse complete with rope trampoline.

EXPERIENCE ATHENS

GO TO THE ZOO: Located at Memorial Park, **Bear Hollow Zoo** (293 Gran Ellen Dr.) is a local habitat that's home to Athena and Yonah, sister bears who are among the main attractions at this sweet spot.

TAKE IN A GAME: Think beyond football. **UGA sports** like soccer, softball, swimming, basketball and hockey are great family entertainment. While some games (especially baseball and gymnastics) require purchased tickets and can sell out, other sports are free to attend and often come with giveaways and other kid-friendly entertainment. Check out georgiadogs.com/calendar. The **Classic City Rollergirls**, our hometown roller derby team, battles squads from around the region at Athens Arena (280 Commerce Blvd.). See classiccityrollergirls.com.

ENJOY NATURE: Spend time inside at **Sandy Creek Nature Center** (205 Old Commerce Road, see ad on p. 21) and learn about nature, our local ecosystem and the environment, or go outside and explore the historic log cabin and the trails. If you're feeling adventurous, take a hike up the 4-mile trail to connect with Sandy Creek Park, which is also a great place to take a dip in the lake. The **Athens-North Oconee River Greenway**, a network of paved paths, is a great way to explore Athens. It's more than 7 miles connecting downtown to places such as Dudley Park, Sandy Creek Nature Center, riverside parks along Athens' north side and, new this year, the UGA campus from Lexington Road. Visit accgov.com/greenway for maps and more details.

READ WITH OTHERS: Find both regular storytimes and special events at the **Athens-Clarke County Library** (2025 Baxter St., see ad on p. 47), which has a large kids area with computers and toys, as well as a large book selection. Children's events include regular Monday afternoon games with local nonprofit Chess and Community, morning storytimes and weekend family events. You can also find free storytimes at both **Avid Bookshop** locations (493 Prince Ave., 1662 S. Lumpkin St.).

GET CREATIVE: We're lucky to have two large, free indoor spaces dedicated to displaying art. First is the **Lyndon House Arts Center** (211 Hoyt St., see ad on p. 16), which has several galleries offering a rotating display of local and national artists. It's run by Athens-Clarke County and also offers workshops and classes for kids and adults throughout the year. The other is the **Georgia Museum of Art** (90 Carlton St.), which features temporary and permanent exhibits throughout the year. Kids events at the museum include teen studio workshops, "Toddler Tuesdays" featuring a kid-friendly activity and monthly Family Day events.


HANG WITH ANIMALS: There are several spots in the area that host upclose animal interactions. If your child is a horse lover, take advantage of a tour at **Classic City Clydesdales** (4190 Price Mill Road, Bishop). Tickets can get pricey—it's \$20 per adult and \$10 per child—but the tour includes meeting the horses as well as highland cows, pigs, chickens, ducks, turkeys and donkeys. In Winterville, check out the nonprofit **Sweet Olive Farm** (855 Parkview Road), home to dozens of rescued animals, such as donkeys, alpacas, exotic birds, and a sheep, goat and pig. Tours take place on Fridays with a recommended donation of \$10 per person. In spring and fall, **Washington Farms** in Watkinsville (5671 Hog Mountain Road) features a petting zoo along with other seasonal activities, such as pig races, a corn maze and a pumpkin slingshot.

TAKE A TOUR: Athens has four historic house museums that are available for self-guided tours. The **Athens Welcome Center** (280 E. Dougherty St., see ad on p. 5) is managed by the Athens-Clarke Heritage Foundation and is open every day except major holidays. The **Taylor-Grady House** (634 Prince Ave.) is managed by the Junior League of Athens and is used for events—call ahead to be sure, but tours (\$3) are generally available during business hours. The **T.R.R. Cobb House** (175 Hill St.) is owned and run by a private foundation, and tours (\$2 donation for adults) are available during business hours. The **Ware-Lyndon House** is adjacent to the Lyndon House Arts Center and is open when the arts center is open.

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
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10 Things to Know About Athens Music

1. It's (Not) Only Rock and Roll

Athens is known for its contributions to the rock and roll canon—our lil' town birthed R.E.M., the B-52s, Pylon, Widespread Panic, Neutral Milk Hotel, of Montreal and Drive-By Truckers, among others—but there's a lot more going on locally. Hip hop continues to boom, with regular rap showcases found downtown and elsewhere. Roots music, including country and Americana, can be found just about everywhere. The Latinx scene is hot, too—more on that below.

2. Beware the 'Khaki Divide'

The running gag is that downtown is split into cultural halves by Lumpkin Street, with the eastern end's bars populated by frat boys rocking out to jammy cover bands, while the west is home to a more heterogeneous set of venues that cater to townies, misfits and curious college kids. (Think of the Georgia Theatre as a sort of DMZ.) The line is often blurred, but in general, this holds true.

3. Dance to Your Own Beat

There are plenty of opportunities to get down on the dance floor, including recurring DJ series—goth, EDM and emo nights are particularly popular with the collegiate set—not to mention silent disco, an international craze that has caught on in Athens over the past couple of years. Attendees pay to rent light-up headphones and dance to their own beat—as part of a crowd—all night long.

4. Early Birds Are Welcome

Athens shows were once infamous for starting absurdly late and ending after last call, but with crowds skewing older, thanks largely to Athens' growing reputation as a great place for retirees and families, local venues are offering earlier events, from the Georgia Theatre's summertime rooftop series to jazz nights at Hendershot's to singer-songwriter circles at The Foundry and more.

5. It's Kid-Friendly

As more Athenians start families, there's been an increased focus on kidcentric music. The leader of the pack is Nuçi's Space, a resource center that offers health services to musicians, plus rehearsal rooms and Camp Amped, where local youth learn to start their own bands. Girls Rock Athens operates a similar program for female and nonbinary kiddos, while Full Moon Studio's Oconee School of Rock serves nearby Watkinsville.

6. There's Culture on Campus

The University of Georgia's cultural programming is open to the public and well worth taking advantage of. The Performing Arts Center brings renowned classical and international artists to Hodgson Concert Hall, with the 2019–'20 schedule featuring Kronos Quartet with Masha Vahdat, the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra with Wynton Marsalis and Béla Fleck and Abigail Washburn, among other marquee names.

7. Festivals Happen Year-Round

In spring, the Athens Human Rights Festival features two days of music downtown, and the Athens Spring Fling pops up on the Eastside. The hip hop- and gospel-centric Hot Corner Celebration takes place in early June, followed by our flagship event, AthFest, later that month. The punky SlopFest returns in July, and the North Georgia Folk Festival impresses each fall. The Wild Rumpus is a Halloweentime hoot. See Annual Events on p. 9 for more.

8. The Latin Scene Is Thriving

Once relegated to the fringes of the local scene, Latin music is a big deal in today's Athens. Several ongoing events feature some of the area's most talented Latinx musicians, including the annual LatinxFest and regular Latin Night series, featuring salsa, bachata and other styles at a rotating list of venues. Meanwhile, talented groups like Athens Tango Project and Bichos Vivos represent the sounds of South America.

9. Tune In to Turn On

You can hear local music all over the airwaves, starting with WUOG 90.5 FM, UGA's student-run station that broadcasts the weekly "Live in the Lobby" showcase. University-chartered NPR affiliate WUGA 91.7 and 94.5 FM airs classical performances, plus The Rotation, a group of shows focused on Athens music. And a Sunday-evening program on rock station Bulldog 93.3 often features local sounds.

10. flagpole Has You Covered

Trust us when we say that *Flagpole* is your No. 1 source for all things Athens music, from the weekly print edition and comprehensive events calendar to our online premieres, photo galleries and live reviews, to the annual *Flagpole* Athens Music Awards and beyond.
