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is a special place: a small town with welcoming people, a big university and many of the amenities of a big city, like vibrant music, arts and food scenes—at least when there's not a pandemic going on. It hasn't always been that way, though. Recent elections have brought a renewed interest in issues of equity of social justice. With that in mind, here's some background through that lens on Athens' history and the current political landscape.

HOW WE GOT HERE

Athens and the University of Georgia have been intertwined from the beginning. The state legislature chartered UGA in 1785, making ours the oldest public university in the country, despite the fact that an upstart school in North Carolina erected a building before we did. Future governor John Milledge, who bought the university's initial 633 acres from early settler Daniel Easley in 1801, named the village-to-be for the Greek cradle of philosophy. Easley, who knew a deal when one came riding up, retained the adjacent land and was happy to sell off his lots to the villagers. Although UGA was situated in the woods to keep it far away from the evil influences of taverns, the villagers quickly learned how to cater to students, and at present, this cradle of philosophy boasts around 100 bars.

The county is named for Elijah Clarke, a Revolutionary War hero who ambushed the British in a swamp down the road at the Battle of Kettle Creek. After the war, he attempted to set up his own nation—the Trans-Oconee Republic—which attacked the Creek Indians and eventually became involved in the Yazoo Land Fraud. Our namesake: right or wrong!

Athens was incorporated in 1806. In the decades that followed, the town became known as the "Manchester of the South" because of its cotton mills. James Camak led the building of the city's first railroad, connecting Athens to Augusta in 1841.

Other than a minor skirmish, Athens saw no action during the Civil War but participated nonetheless. The Cook and Bros. armory across the river from downtown—now the Chicopee-Dudley building—manufactured rifles for the Confederacy. On a lighter note, local dentist John Gilleland devised a double-barreled cannon that failed spectacularly when tested. The chain connecting the balls snapped, knocking over a chimney and killing a cow. The cannon is now displayed outside City Hall, facing north.

Many prominent rebels—including Confederate Vice President Alexander H. Stephens, former U.S. House Speaker Howell Cobb and his brother, T.R.R. Cobb, whose writings defended slavery—had ties to Athens. Plantation slave labor funded the construction of many grand antebellum homes, such as those of the Cobb brothers. T.R.R. Cobb's home is now a house museum in the Cobbham neighborhood. A downtown Confederate monument, though, has been removed to a spot off the Loop 10 highway.

By the turn of the century, Athens had public schools, a police force and its first streetcar suburbs: Cobbham, Boulevard and Five Points. (The last remaining streetcar-stop shelter can be seen at the corner of Lumpkin and Cedar streets.) In 1891, the State Normal School, a teacher's college, opened in what's now called Normaltown. The U.S. Navy took over the college in the 1950s, training its supply corpsmen there. When the Navy school moved to Rhode Island in 2011, UGA acquired the property and turned it into a health sciences campus in conjunction with Augusta University.

In the early 20th Century, Black-owned businesses were flourishing downtown on the Hot Corner at Hull and Washington streets, centered around the Morton Theatre, which was built by wealthy developer Monroe "Pink" Morton, the son of a former slave. But race relations remained tense. Hamilton Holmes and Charlayne Hunter integrated UGA in 1961, sparking near-riots. In 1964, Athens Klansmen murdered Lemuel Penn, a black Army Reserve officer who was passing through town late at night. Marches and sit-ins were held at the popular fast-food restaurant The Varsity (recently closed). Local public schools didn't fully integrate until 1970, 16 years after Brown v. Board of Education. This was also the

time of "urban renewal," which tore down whole Black neighborhoods, such as Linnentown, on Baxter Hill, which was razed in the early 1960s to make way for new UGA high-rise dorms.

A decade later, the Model Cities program brought millions of dollars in federal money to provide much-needed infrastructure—street paving, water lines and sewerage, structural rehabilitation and a neighborhood health center—to East Athens, a predominately Black and poor area of town. Model Cities, through its citizen-participation component, also empowered a generation of Black citizens who went on to elected and appointed positions within the governmental and civic life of Athens.

Downtown largely emptied out when Georgia Square Mall opened on Atlanta Highway in 1981, paving the way for Athens to become the music mecca it is today. R.E.M. was about to hit it big, and, fueled by low-interest loans from the new Athens Downtown Development Authority, entrepreneurs took advantage of the vacancies to open venues that quickly became popular—some even iconic, like the 40 Watt Club, the Georgia Theatre and the late-lamented Caledonia Lounge.

Clarke County and the City of Athens, after two previous failed attempts, merged in 1990, and the newly unified Athens-Clarke County elected Gwen O'Looney as its first female chief executive and first progressive mayor.

Today, the mall is struggling and may be redeveloped, while downtown has become in some ways a victim of its own success. The proliferation of luxury apartment complexes has brought rising rents and more chain businesses, increasingly catering to (mostly white) students and pushing locally owned businesses out into the Five Points, Normaltown and Chase Park areas. Historically Black neighborhoods like East Athens and the Hancock Corridor that have suffered for decades from lack of investment are now ripe for gentrification.

These issues and more galvanized voters in 2018. They swept five new, more liberal commissioners into office and chose another progressive, Kelly Girtz, as mayor in a landslide. The new group is now tackling issues like affordable housing and criminal justice reform. Girtz is running for re-election this year, and odd-numbered commission seats will also be on the nonpartisan ballot May 24.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

Flagpole's City Dope column is a great resource for keeping up with local politics. The ACC Commission includes 10 members, each representing a district, and the mayor, who is elected countywide and presides over meetings but only votes in case of a tie. An appointed manager runs the government's day-to-day operations. The commission meets at least three times a month: Work sessions, where staff give presentations on upcoming decisions, are at 5:30 p.m. on the second Tuesday; agenda-setting meetings, which include further discussion as well as public input, are at 6 p.m. on the third Tuesday; voting meetings are at 6 p.m. on the first Tuesday of the following month. When not held remotely, all three are at City Hall (301 College Ave.) and televised on Channel 180 on Charter cable and streamed at youtube.com/accgov. Agendas and contact information for county officials are available at accgov.com.

The Clarke County Board of Education, composed of nine members who elect a president from among themselves, meets at the new headquarters on the former Piedmont College campus (595 Prince Avenue) on the first and second Thursdays of the month at 6 p.m. Superintendent Xernona Thomas heads the Clarke County School District. Its website is clarke.k12.ga.us. Agendas are posted at boarddocs.com/ga/clarke/Board.nsf/Public 24 hours before the meeting.

Although Athens votes reliably Democratic, Republicans in the Georgia legislature have kindly used their mathematical skills to arrange the districts so that Athens is represented by five Republicans and just one Democrat in the state legislature. Republicans still dominate both the House and the Senate, despite losing seats in 2018, when Gov. Brian Kemp only narrowly defeated Democrat Stacey Abrams (without much help from his hometown of Athens). The state flipped blue in 2020, sending senators Raphael Warnock and Jon Ossoff and President Joe Biden to Washington. The General Assembly meets for 40 working days a year, starting on the second Monday in January and usually ending sometime in late March (in time for the Masters golf tournament). Check legis.ga.gov to contact legislators, read the text of bills and watch the action on livestream.

Athens has numerous activist groups working on labor, discrimination, LGBTQ, immigration, transportation and other issues. An incomplete list includes the Clarke County Democrats (clarkecounty.com), Athens Anti-Discrimination Movement (aadmovement.org), Athens Immigrant Rights Coalition (athensimmigrantrights.org), Athens PRIDE (athenspride.org),

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When restrictions on gatherings aren't in place, UGA also hosts nearly daily lectures, exhibitions, readings and discussion groups that are open to the public; check *Flagpole's* Calendar or calendar.uga.edu for the latest.

HOW TO GET AROUND

WALK/BIKE: Downtown, North Campus and most intown neighborhoods are compact and easy to navigate on foot or bike. BikeAthens has a map of bike paths. (Drivers, remember to stop for pedestrians, and allow three feet between your car and bicyclists!) The North Oconee River Greenway runs from Sandy Creek Nature Center through downtown to College Station Road, except for one gap near Oconee Hill Cemetery still under construction. The Firefly Trail runs from The Mark development on the southern edge of downtown east to Hancock Road and will eventually extend to downtown Winterville. A modern trestle based on the partially destroyed one pictured on the back cover of R.E.M.'s *Murmur* is also planned.

DRIVE: On-street parking downtown is \$1.50 per hour between 8 a.m.–10 p.m. Monday–Saturday, with a two-hour time limit from 8 a.m.–6 p.m. Meters accept cards and coins. Tickets will run you \$20–\$25. Avoid the risk by parking in a deck—they're free for the first half-hour (and all day Sunday) and \$1 per hour after that. Most surface lots are operated at night and on weekends by National Parking, which usually charges \$5 and can tow or boot you if you don't pay. On campus, surface lots are permit-only, so visitors should park in a deck. See downtownathensga.org and parking.uga.edu for more.

TAKE A CAB: Athens taxis are mostly large vans shared with other passengers. Fares aren't metered; they're based on zones and should be posted inside the cab. Vans gather by the Arch late at night. Expect to be asked whether you're going to the Eastside or Westside. With multiple stops to make, the ride might take a while. Uber and Lyft also operate in Athens.

TAKE A BUS: Athens Transit (athenstransit.com) buses leave in all directions from the Multimodal Center on East Broad Street, down the hill from downtown. At present, both Athens Transit and Campus Transit (transit.uga.edu) are free and open to the public—just hop on, but wear a mask. Campus buses mostly run through campus (duh), with additional routes from the main campus to the Health Sciences Campus in Normaltown and the Veterinary Teaching Hospital on the Eastside that don't stop in between. Both agencies have apps that allow you to find stops and track buses.

SKIP TOWN: Southeastern Stages (southeasternstages.com) intercity buses leave from 4020 Atlanta Hwy. Groome Transportation (groometransportation.com) will take you from one of several pick-up locations to Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport in Atlanta. Athens is still searching for a commercial aviation carrier to fly into and out of our spiffy airport. Amtrak's Crescent (amtrak.com) stops in Gainesville on its run between New Orleans and New York City. Athens may one day be a stop on a proposed high-speed rail line between Atlanta and Charlotte, but likely not for decades.



Ricker" and "Carrie Mae Weems: The Usual Suspects." Admission is free, as are almost all of its many events: gallery tours, lectures, films, workshops for teens and family activities.

The hotel also features a handful of local artists such as Mark Steinmetz, Brittany Lauback, Alex Murawski and Rebecca Kreisler in its permanent collection.

After establishing itself as one of the largest handmade markets in the Southeast, Indie South opened a brick-and-mortar boutique full of artisan, handcrafted and vintage goods, rare plants, crystals, jewelry, books, decor, unique gifts and more. The space, which also houses its own screen printing studio, now stocks several popular artists including David Hale and Chris Hubbard. In between huge biannual craft fairs, Indie South hosts creative classes and popup markets.

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Art Decko: Organized by the Athens Area Arts Council, Art Decko is a series of nine large-scale paintings installed on each floor of the Vertical Gallery, an unconventional stairwell-turned-art space in the College Avenue Parking Deck. Artists include Ashley Anderson (paying tribute to the 20th anniversary of Neutral Milk Hotel's *In the Airplane Over the Sea*), Jared Brown, Jeremy Kiran Fernandes, Ruth Allen, Jacob Wenzka, Hannah Betzel, Will Eskridge, Jeanne Whatley and Dorian Edwards. athensarts.org

Art Shelters: Serving transit riders while also injecting creativity into the built environment, many of Athens-Clarke County Transit's bus shelters double as public art. The program produced 11 art shelters between two phases in 2005 and 2011 as a partnership between ACC Transit and the Athens Area Arts Council called "You, Me and the Bus." Under the guidance of the Athens Cultural Affairs Commission, ACC Transit added a new round of 13 art shelters and an additional 20 artist-designed laser cut shelters in 2020. Look out for Joni Younkins-Herzog's giant pillbug on Lexington Road and Richard Herzog's larger-than-life gingko leaves on North Avenue. accgov. com/9591/Art-Shelters

Athens Creative Directory: Organized by the Athens-Clarke County Economic Development Department and CREATE Athens (a division of Envision Athens), the Athens Creative Directory serves as a hub for finding and interacting with creatives working in a variety of disciplines. Athens Mural Alley: Located downtown in between Clayton and Washington streets, the new Athens Mural Alley activates an otherwise overlooked alley into a walk-through art experience. Artists include John Ahee, Tayler Ayers, Luka Carter, Maria Elias, Elinor Saragoussi Phillips, Tori Watson and Beaux Xavier. The series joins Taylor Shaw's "ATHENS Mural," which resembles a vintage "Greetings from..." postcard and celebrates the Classic City as a musical mecca. Part of the Athens Music Walk of Fame, the mural depicts a collage of local music references embedded into the block letters: Pylon, Widespread Panic, The B-52's and more. accgov.com/9971/ Athens-Mural-Alley-Project

Cobbham Triangle Park: Occupying the slice of land nestled between Prince Avenue, Cobb and Harris streets, the Cobbham Triangle Park is a neighborhood gathering spot accentuated by public art. Highlights include an entranceway designed by St. Udio, a mosaic sitting wall called "Flow" by Krysia Ara, a towering sculpture called "Spirit of Inspiration" by Harold Rittenberry, a new "Venus Flower of Love" sculpture by Steve Sweetser and granite sculptures by Stan Mullins for games of chess and ping pong. Fire Up the Hydrants: A project of the Athens-Clarke County Public Utilities Department, Fire Up the Hydrants transformed 20 ordinary hydrants into functional, life-saving works of art. 
Hope: Located downtown on the exterior walls of Epiphany Athens and The Rook & Pawn, David Hale's mural, "Hope," depicts barn swallows—a symbol of rebirth and hope—flying across a prismatic, rainbow-colored sky. "Hope" celebrates the 25th anniversary of the AthFest Mural and Arts Festival, and replaced "BirdSong," Hale's mural of 20 species of native songbirds that was commissioned by AthFest Educates to commemorate the festival's 20th anniversary. athfesteducates.org

Hot Corner—An Athens Legacy: Located at the corner of Lumpkin and Washington streets, "Hot Corner: An Athens Legacy" is dedicated to the rich history of Hot Corner, a hub of African-American entrepreneurship. Organized by the Athens Cultural Affairs Commission with support from a National Endowment for the Arts grant, the mural was created by Miamibased muralist Elio Mercado and local artist Broderick Flanigan. facebook. com/HotCornerORG

Project Ginkgo: Beautifying the concrete bases of light poles with intricate mosaics, Krysia Ara's Project Ginkgo adds glittering charm and color into the downtown landscape. Funded by the Athens Downtown Development Authority, each design is unique and can be found outside of Flicker Theatre and Bar, The World Famous, Morton Theatre, Epiphany, Creature Comforts, Musician's Warehouse, Ciné, Chamber of Commerce, Post Office, Last Resort and Ted's Most Best. creativeflow.art

Rainbow Forest: Visible from Martin Luther King Parkway on the North Oconee River Greenway, "Rainbow Forest" is a new public art installation by Los Angeles-based designer Andrew Kovacs, who worked alongside local artist assistants Eli Saragoussi and Patrick Sprague. Supported by the Athens Cultural Affairs Commission and unveiled last August, the installation consists of a grid of 36 brightly colored columns. athensculturalaffairs.org

Sculptures and Murals: Athens' most recognizable sculptures are a series of giant bulldogs painted in colorful designs. To see more sculptures, visit Steve Sweetser's kinetic "Tree of Oneta" near the historic Southern Mill complex or Abbot Pattison's infamous "Iron Horse" on Athens Highway in Watkinsville. Popular murals include Eleanor Davis' at home.made, Dave Jenkins' at Last Resort Grill, Anthony Wislar at Creature Comforts Brewery, Jamie Calkin at Flowerland and Michael Ross at Procoat Painting. flagpole.com

Run by Athens-Clarke County, the arts center displays professional exhibitions in large, sunny galleries upstairs and down, while the Ware-Lyndon House museum offers a glimpse into Athens' past through period decor and artifacts. In addition to offering classes instructed by professional artists, summer camps and the occasional festival, the center serves as meeting grounds for local craft groups. A gift shop features items created by regional artists. The 47th annual "Juried Exhibition" showcases talents from Athens and surrounding counties.

Madison-Morgan Cultural Center

The nonprofit is outside of Athens in a beautifully restored 1895 Romanesque Revival building. Programming ranges from visual art exhibitions to performing arts, and annual events include an antiques show, chamber music festival and tour of homes. Permanent exhibitions include a 1895 schoolroom, a gallery of original furnishings from the Arts and Crafts Period, a museum of Piedmont history and a series of portraits by George Andrews aka "The Dot Man."

Smaller exhibitions are hosted in a converted classroom adjacent to the main gallery.



GO PLAY OUTSIDE

Athens-Clarke County has more than a dozen playgrounds, each with its unique set of slides and surroundings. If you're looking for open fields instead of swings, check out the open areas around the extensive playground at Southeast Clarke Park (325 Whit Davis Road). If you're looking for a smaller neighborhood playground, check out Reese and Pope Park (375 Reese St.) or Boulevard Woods (298 Barber St.). Note that parks may close a few hours each week for regular maintenance, so check out accgov.com/2550/Playgrounds for schedules and the full list of locations.

If you want to head into the woods, find trails and a new naturescape play area at Sandy Creek Nature Center (205 Old Commerce Road and also accessible via the Greenway). Southeast Clarke Park has wooded trails connecting its two locations. There's also the Birchmore Trail at Memorial Park (293 Gran Ellen Drive), and Ben Burton Park (615 Mitchell Bridge Road) has walking routes along the river.

Beyond county parks, there are also extensive trails at the State Botanical Garden of Georgia (2450 S. Milledge Ave.) that will take you along the North Oconee River and through restored wetlands. Use the boardwalk to explore the floodplain, or check out the recent native grasses restoration project. Along with the specimen gardens, don't miss the Alice H. Richards Children's Garden. And UGA's Oconee Forest Park (110 Lake Herrick Drive), beside the intramural fields, offers a trail system around Lake Herrick. You can even bring your fishing poles.

SPEED IT UP

Lake Herrick also allows non-motorized boating, so it's a good spot to try out a canoe or kayak with the kids. Sandy Creek Park's Lake Chapman (400 Bob Holman Road) is also a good option for putting in your own watercraft or renting one from the county (weather and staff permitting). Note that admission to the park is \$2/person for ages 4–64. Ben Burton Park also offers a spot to launch your canoe or kayak.

If the kids want to take out the bikes, skateboards or scooters, you have options. For gently rolling paved trails through much of downtown Athens, check out the Greenway's network. You can connect from Sandy Creek Nature Center to Dudley Park, the Firefly Trail and South Campus (accgov.com/greenway). If you haven't explored the latest section of the Firefly Trail through downtown Winterville, it's worth the ride. Or take your bikes off-road at Walker Park (200 Trail Creek St.), which has several trails maintained by the local chapter of the Southern Off-Road Bicycle Association (sorbaathens.com). You can also find paved trails at Bishop Park (705 Sunset Drive), Southeast Clarke Park (the opposite side from the playground, at 4440 Lexington Road) and Memorial Park.

LEARN AROUND US


The Lyndon House Arts Center (211 Hoyt St.) is open for socially distanced viewing of its art exhibitions and has multiple exhibitions on display at any time. Youth classes are now scheduled, so check accgov.com/lyndonhouse for details. The Georgia Museum of Art (90 Carlton St.) is open with timed ticketing in the galleries and programming for children and teens. Some events are in-person while some remain virtual, so check georgiamuseum.org for upcoming themes and details.

In addition to trails at Sandy Creek Nature Center, kids can now learn inside and out. The naturescape play area gives kids a space to investigate while they play, and inside the center they can explore STEM topics such as electricity, our food, planets and pollinators. It makes for a cool option on a hot afternoon. For more natural wonders, visit the animals at Memorial Park's Bear Hollow Zoo (and visit the ducks at the nearby pond—but please don't bring bread!).

The libraries in the Athens Regional Library System rotate storytime events that are both in-person and virtual. Visit www.athenslibrary.org for updates, or drop in to the Athens-Clarke County Library (2025 Baxter St.) to just experience the space and the helpful children's librarians.

To help give kids a glimpse of Athens history, drop by the Historic Athens Welcome Center (280 E. Dougherty St.) or the Ware-Lyndon House adjacent to the Lyndon House Arts Center. Both are open for self-guided tours during business hours, and the Welcome Center also offers kid-friendly scavenger hunts and online tours of other notable buildings on its Facebook page.







1. It's (Not) Only Rock and Roll

Athens is known for its contributions to the rock and roll canon—our lil' town birthed R.E.M., the B-52s, Pylon, Widespread Panic, Neutral Milk Hotel, of Montreal and Drive-By Truckers, among others—but there's a lot more going on locally. Hip hop continues to boom, and the Latinx scene is hot, too. Roots music, including country and Americana, can be found just about everywhere, as can experimental and genre-defying acts.

2. Music Venues Range in Size and Focus

Though the live entertainment industry has been severely impacted by the pandemic, Athens is still home to a remarkably high number of music venues, given its population size. The best bets for catching major touring acts have always been the 40 Watt Club and Georgia Theatre, while Southern Brewing Company, Flicker Theatre & Bar, Hendershot's Coffee Bar and Nowhere Bar are dependable choices for catching local bands any night of the week.

3. Festivals Happen Year-Round

While the pandemic threw a wrench into many yearly traditions, most festivals have been able to continue with virtual or modified protocols in place. Spring stays busy between the Athens Human Rights Festival and International Street Festival. The hip hop- and gospel-centric Hot Corner Celebration takes place in early summer, followed by Athens' flagship event, the AthFest Music and Arts Festival. In fall, the North Georgia Folk Festival livens Sandy Creek Park, LatinxFest fills downtown with performances, Historic Athens PorchFest takes over neighborhoods and the Wild Rumpus Parade & Spectacle is a Halloween-time hoot.

4. It's Kid-Friendly

As more Athenians start families, there's been an increased focus on kid-centric music and music education. The leader of the pack is Nuçi's Space, a resource center that offers health services to musicians, plus rehearsal rooms and Camp Amped, where local youth learn to start their own bands. We Rock Athens operates a similar program for female and nonbinary kiddos, while Full Moon Studio serves nearby Watkinsville with summer camps and biannual "rockcitals."

5. There's an Athens Music Walk of Fame

The Athens Music Walk of Fame debuted in 2020 to honor the movers and shakers who helped place our town on the map as a musical destination, and new inductees are added every year. The walk recognizes honorees with bronze plaques that are embedded along a route that passes notable music venues. An interactive mobile app offers additional sights and sounds associated with each honoree.

6. Tune In to Turn On

You can hear local music all over the airwaves, starting with WUOG 90.5 FM, UGA's student-run station that broadcasts "Live in the Lobby" performances every Tuesday and Thursday. University-chartered NPR affiliate WUGA 91.7 and 94.5 FM airs "Sound of Athens" and "New South Showcase," segments of live concert recordings.

7. See Athens on the Screen

Tony Gayton's 1987 documentary Athens, GA: Inside/Out is essential viewing for any aspiring local music buff for its interviews and live footage from the mid-80s scene. For a glimpse into today's cultural landscape, check out local filmmaker James Preston's pair of documentaries Athens Rising: The Sicyon Project and Athens Rising 2: Transmittance (both free at athensrising.com), which compile vignettes of DIY house shows, festivals, performance art, comedy, restaurants and other interesting local organizations and independent businesses. Released in 2021, Red Turns Into Blue: Athens, Inside-Out 2 follows up on multiple performers who appeared in the first film, then introduces several popular artists of today.

8. It's a Recording Destination

Behind the tremendous number of albums churned out by up-and-coming artists each year are the recording studios in and around Athens that perfect and preserve their work. Chase Park Transduction, The Glow Recording Studio, Pigpen Studios, Full Moon Studio and several others stay busy year-round. Tweed Recording Audio Production School, a world-class facility located downtown, aims to train the next generation of audio professionals.

9. There's Culture on Campus

Though its sheer size and a lack of effective town-gown communication can make the university seem intimidating to newcomers, its cultural programming is open to the public and worth taking advantage of. The Performing Arts Center brings in acclaimed classical and world-music artists, with the 2022–23 season including Edgar Meyer and The Scottish Ensemble, George Hinkchliffe's Ukulele Orchestra of Great Britain, The Milk Carton Kids, and Béla Fleck and Abigail Washburn.

10. Flagpole Has You Covered

Trust us when we say that *Flagpole* is your No. 1 source for all things Athens music, from the weekly print edition and comprehensive events calendar to our online premieres, photo galleries, live reviews and beyond. Covering local music was our founding mission, and it remains an integral part of who we are at *Flagpole* and what we do.
